6th of June marked the date of **INVESTIGATOR MEETING** for ASPIRED - a multi-centre trial looking at an ambulatory ECG monitor in unexplained syncope patients.

Thank you all who participated, shared their knowledge and experience!







We are excited to announce a new collaboration with our older adults colleague, Alixe Kilgour, who is the Investigator for FORCE:SEE.

This study is looking at the over 70's being admitted to AMU to try and determine if handgrip strength and frailty status can predict adverse outcomes, following acute medical admission as well as predicting 30 day readmission rates. We will test handgrip strength using a dynamometre, assess gait and movement and complete brief questionnaires within 48hours of admission and prior to discharge.

Excitingly, we will be able to recruit participants who may lack capacity due to dementia or delirium. This is a fantastic opportunity to include these participants in a worthwhile study!

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#Red4Research 2

Supporting research & all the people making research happen

On 16th of June our Team celebrated Red4Research Day with the NHS Lothian R&D Director to promote research in Scotland!





POS-ARI-ER is a Perpetual Observational Study of patients with suspected Acute **Respiratory Infections** presenting **Emergency Rooms** and other acute hospital care settings. Jon Carter is the Investigator for this study.

Primary objectives of the study include the various describing diagnostic investigations performed, the treatments administered and the clinical outcomes of the participants.

Participants will be recruited within the first 2 days of hospital admission and baseline data will be collected on day 0 and outcome data on day 28. The study also involves obtaining nasopharyngeal swabs for a subset of participants based on randomisation.

A total of 40 European sites will be established with the aim of recruiting a total of 11,750 participants over 3.5 years.

EMERGE will aim to recruit 100 participants per year between the RIE and SJH sites.

Our ED research led to the early rule out pathway we use daily to discharge patients SAFELY and SOONER for suspected ACS



Reduced overall length of stay by 3.3 hrs





Increased the proportion of patients discharged directly from the ED from 50% to 71%
